

Simple home page - 2

Objectives

When you have completed this worksheet you will have created a home page for an author publicising a new book.

What you need to know

- the basic *<tags>* that structure the webpage
- how to underline, make text bold, change a fonts style...
- how to change the background colour by the menu bar through the *<body>* tag
- how to place an image
- how to introduce a horizontal line and breaking to a new line to either through the menu bars or via *<tags>* in the code view

New

- how to make text flow around an image

Tasks

1. Open Frontpage
2. View the **code** for the page
3. Change the information in the *<title>* tag to contain your name and tutor group
4. View the **design** page
5. Change the background to be a pale yellow colour
6. Introduce a title which goes in the middle of the page

Tintin's Spanish Holiday

7. This title is to be in **Kristen Solid Italic** size 30, coloured dark green
8. Insert a line break so that the next item will appear on the following line.
9. Find a picture of Tintin (who is a cartoon character) like this one on the internet. Save it to the computer where you are working. Insert this picture under the title.
10. Change the size of the image as it is viewed on your page to have a width of not more than 300 pixels and a height of not more than 500 pixels. Hint: *Double click on the picture.*
11. Insert this text under the picture of Tintin. Write it in **Trebuchet MS** size 14, coloured dark green:



Tintin needed a break. He was also fed up with constantly being on holiday in France. His dog, Snowy, needed a change as well. Tintin had never been to Spain - in fact he had never really been anywhere. Some sun, the beach, plenty of space for Snowy to run around... Sounded very good, but where in Spain? It is a big place.

12. Change each occurrence of **Tintin** to be **bold**.
13. You should notice now that the words you are typing appear alongside but at the bottom (or underneath) the picture.
14. Double click on the image. Change the "Wrapping Style" **Left**
15. You should now see that the text is alongside the picture with the picture on the left. If you want the text on the left, picture on the right then go back and change the wrapping to be **Right**
16. Find a picture of a cartoon dog like this (better if you can find Tintin's dog Snowy) and save it on the computer you are working at.
17. Introduce a line break and then a horizontal line which is centred and runs for 50% across the page.
18. Place your picture of the dog under the horizontal line.



19. Under the dog picture type in this text. Write it in **Tempus Sans ITC** size 14, centred and coloured black:

Tiny and Tintin just wanted to soak up the sun but from behind the sand dune appeared the familiar form of Captain Haddock and General Alcazar

20. Give yourself 2 blank lines space and then place this text in **Arial Black**, size 10 and underlined:

Last update: 28 February 2007

21. Print a copy of the CODE for this page.
22. Print a copy of the PREVIEW of this page.
23. Use a highlighting pen and mark the part of the tags in the code printout that has aligned the pictures
